Transportation Services

- Surrey is well connected through the TransLink public transit system, which includes buses, SkyTrain, and community shuttles.
- The nearest SkyTrain stations to ATC Surrey are King George Station and Surrey Central Station.
- Students can use a Compass Card to pay for transit services. Compass Cards can be purchased and reloaded online or at SkyTrain stations.
